Bernard E. Harcourt is Isidor and Seville Sulzbacher Professor of Law and Political Science at Columbia University. His scholarship intersects social and political theory, the sociology of punishment, and penal law and procedure. He is the author of *The Counterrevolution: How Our Government Went to War Against Its Own Citizens* (2018), *Exposed: Desire and Disobedience in the Digital Age* (2015), *The Illusion of Free Markets: Punishment and the Myth of Natural Order* (2011), *Against Prediction: Punishing and Policing in an Actuarial Age* (2007), *Language and the Gun: Youth, Crime, and Public Policy* (2005), and *Illusion of Order: The False Promise of Broken-Windows Policing* (2001).
